### LIMITED CERTIFICATION TRAINING WORKSHOP

If Commercial Landscape Maintenance workers want to **legally** apply "Caution" labeled pesticides including herbicides in ornamental beds in and around the landscape they are required by law to be in possession of a chapter 482 "Limited Commercial Landscape Maintenance license". In order to obtain this license the operator must provide to the Florida Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services (FDACS) Bureau of Entomology & Pest Control the following items:

1. A LIMITED CERTIFICATION FOR COMMERCIAL LANDSCAPE MAINTENANCE PERSONNEL APPLICATION WITH ATTACHED 11/2 x 11/2 inch PHOTO
2. PROOF OF BUSINESS INSURANCE
3. CHECK FOR \$150.00 MADE OUT TO FDACS
4. **IN ADDITION:** The applicant must also attend a 6-hour certified Commercial Landscape Maintenance Training workshop, **plus** pass a Limited Certification Landscape Maintenance exam with a score of 70% or higher.

On **Friday, February 17, 2012** the St. Lucie County Extension will be offering the certified 6-hour Commercial Landscape Maintenance Training workshop that is needed to obtain your 482 Limited Certification Landscape Maintenance pesticide license plus offer the exam after the training.
